



ReMade, the first Italian certification scheme for recycled content recognised by EA – European co-operation for Accreditation

ReMade Foundation is proud to announce that the ReMade certification scheme is the first Italian certification scheme for recycled content in products to be recognised within the European accreditation system coordinated by EA – European co-operation for accreditation.

In July 2026, the ReMade certification scheme received a positive evaluation from EA. EA is the organisation that brings together the national accreditation bodies across the European region, ensuring the harmonisation and mutual recognition of accreditation systems throughout European countries, EFTA countries and the countries bordering the Mediterranean Sea.

Following its pioneering role as Italy's first certification scheme for recycled material content under the ReMade in Italy trademark, developed thanks to the collaboration and support of ACCREDIA, the Italian accreditation body, ReMade has now reached another important milestone with its positive evaluation by EA, enabling the scheme to be recognised within the European accreditation system.

This achievement represents another significant step in the growth of ReMade Foundation and its certification scheme, following the certification of the torch used for the latest Winter Olympic Games.

The ReMade certification scheme verifies and certifies the origin and traceability of recycled materials and byproducts contained in any type of product or material, including multi-material products, ensuring a reliable assessment throughout the entire supply chain.

To date, more than 400 companies have chosen ReMade certification for over 8,000 certified products listed in the online catalogue available at <https://www.remade.it/en/catalogo-remade/>.

The scheme is supported by a network of 9 accredited certification bodies, 203 qualified auditors and 156 consultants operating throughout Italy.

The positive evaluation by EA confirms the technical robustness and institutional value of the ReMade certification scheme. Transparent rules, rigorous assessment criteria, the independence of Conformity assessment bodies and a sound governance framework ensure a reliable certification system for businesses, public authorities and consumers alike.

The positive evaluation by EA enables the ReMade certification scheme to be recognised by the 47 national accreditation bodies that are members of EA and allows those accreditation bodies to accredit conformity assessment bodies operating under the ReMade scheme.

The interaction between national accreditation bodies, conformity assessment bodies and the ReMade certification scheme ensures high levels of oversight, impartiality and comparability of certification results.

For companies, this means being able to rely on ReMade certification as a trusted and widely recognised tool across a broad geographical area, supporting market access, international supply chain management and the demonstration of their commitment to the circular economy.
